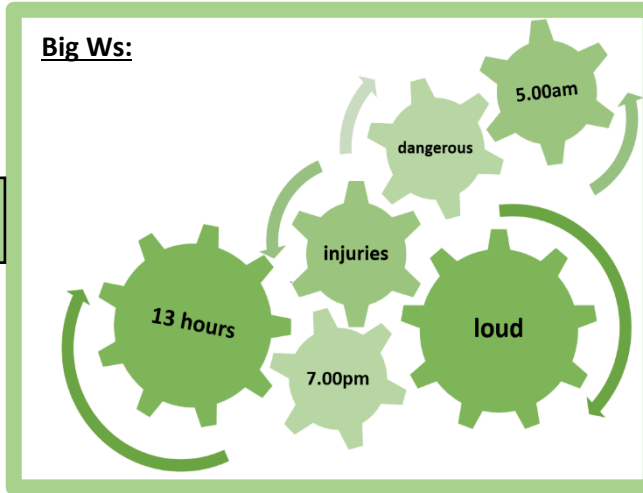
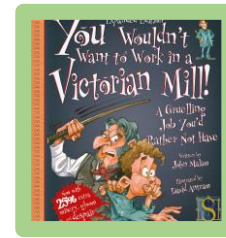




“Would you want to be a Victorian mill worker?” (History)



Limited work to **6.5 hours a day** with **3 hours schooling.**

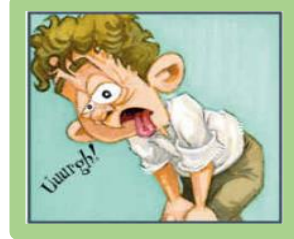
Factory Act 1874

Important People
Titus Salt (1803 –1876)

➤ First mill owner in Bradford to introduce the **Ten-Hour Factory Act.**



Doffer

- **Removed doffs** (a spindle with spun wool).
- Replaced them with **empty ones.**

Scavenger

- Worked **under machines.**
- Brushed **dirt and fluff** off the floor.

Tenter

- Kept an eye on looms.
- Checked for **broken thread.**
